PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Nancy reported on a check we received from the Network for Good which turned out to be a FaceBook donation request from one of our Volunteers in celebration of his birthday. She also reported on a Department of Justice RF-C registration which requires the certification of our By-Laws, which is now done. It will require an annual report which can be done on line. We will need to vote to amend our By-Laws with this addition. Discussion held on when we could coordinate this with another event to get the necessary majority vote. Nancy also told us that a binder holding all important legal information re the Auxiliary is now in the Chief's office in the Auxiliary drawer.

NEW BUSINESS: The Volunteer Association is requesting 3-5 Auxiliary members to help with the Pancake Breakfast, scheduled for September 24th from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. The Open House is set for October 8th from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Auxiliary

volunteers are needed for setup and cleanup and to cook hot dogs. Chief talked about planned events, all of which are free with many handouts. Future trainings discussed. FFF&R team will meet on 9/21 at 9 a.m. for rig cleaning and SCBA bottle fill – last about two hours. Tentative date of 10/22 for CPR class – 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. for 10 people. Tentative date of 11/12 for fuel reduction class. We might have a fire extinguisher class in December.

CHIEF'S REPORT: Chief Crume

Chief discussed fire response when a property is out of the district (not our responsibility) but with properties on either side being in the district – action – we respond. 6601 is back in service. New 6662 emergency lights, siren and radio are now being installed. SCBA flow testing was completed in August. Volunteer of the month is Phillip Lane, a past graduate of our student program and one of our seasonal firefighters. August was a busy month with wildland fires, structure fires and mutual responses.
